From the Pastor...

"The only thing that is the end of the world is the end of the world." A pastor friend of mine with whom I served at a previous church used to say that all the time. And he was right. It is not the end of the world, not yet. And, for us in November of 2020, no matter "how bad" we think things are around us... in our personal lives, in our nation, in our world... it's not the end of the world, not yet.

November 2020

Consider the Israelites of the 5th century BC when they were hauled off to Babylon,

spending 70 years in exile following the complete sacking of Jerusalem. The suffering was immense. The inhumanity was horrendous. I cannot imagine what they went through. And, when they arrived in Babylon, they were more than in despair. To them, they had been taken away from the core of their faith and belief, Jerusalem, displaced from access to the Temple of God, removed from all that they thought was of ultimate value in their relationship with God. They could not conceive of living in a foreign land apart from all that Jerusalem stood for in their faith. It felt that they lost it all, including their God, since to them at that time, they were convinced that God's "dwelling" was in the Temple in Jerusalem. In fact, in Psalm 139, the psalmist writes the following while sitting along the banks of the waters of Babylon: "How can we sing the Lord's song in a foreign land?" They thought it was the end of the world, but the only thing that is the end of the world is the end of the world.

Over time, the Israelites discovered that they could, in fact, sing the Lord's song in a foreign land. They settled down there in Babylon, they married, they bought fields and planted crops, they lived life, they prospered, they even found God there. In fact, during this period of the exile, some of the most important shifts in Jewish theology emerged. Apart from the Temple in Jerusalem, they discovered the idea of the synagogue, those smaller local gatherings of Jews for worship. It was their version of "church." Exile, it turns out, wasn't the end of the world. Not at all. Arguably, much good came during the season of the exile. That didn't mean getting there was fun, not at all. It was hard; it had its costs. But, even in exile, God was active. In fact, God was active in new ways in the life of Israel. Exile, it turns out, wasn't the end of the world after all.

No matter what happens around us, it isn't the end of the world unless it is, in fact, the end of the world. Until Jesus returns, we will have "wars and rumors of wars, but the end is not yet." And, until Jesus does return, there is time for growth, for positive change, for learning, for expanding, for faith. There is opportunity for something good to come during even the hardest of seasons.

As followers of Jesus, we must keep our faith focused on Jesus, not on what is "wrong" around us. In fact, what is "wrong" around us sometimes turns out to be the very "exile" that God will use to bring about something good in us. Hard, but also good. "God is at work in all things to bring about good for those who love Him and are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28, paraphrased). So, church, don't worry. It's not the end of the world. In fact, it might just be the beginning of something good. After all, "God causes His rain to fall upon the righteous and the unrighteous" (Matthew 5:45, paraphrased). He's a good God, isn't He?! - Rendell

Pastoral Care Encouragement

One day this past week, as I was working on the Prayer Board in the sanctuary, I looked at all the names on the prayer list. I thought about each person and the battles they are facing with sickness, loneliness and other situations with themselves and their families. As I sat there and pondered on that, I began to realize how much they need our prayers and the privilege of them entrusting us to pray for them. I know about some of their situations, but some I do not. I bowed and asked God to use Calvary folks to continue to reach out to them through prayer because He knows each situation very well. Then, I thought about how I learned to pray. I know you have heard much about my grandmother over the years, so here is another inspiring thing she taught me how to do – pray. Just as Jesus' disciples ask him how to pray, I watched and asked my Granny how to pray. She was a busy lady taking care of a farm and nine people daily. However, she would take at least 30 minutes a day, in the middle of the day, to stop and read her Bible and pray - every single day of her life. She would get up at 4am every morning and start the wood stove to cook breakfast for all of us. I remember one morning very well - I got up and quietly eased to the doorway of the kitchen, she was sitting and waiting on the wood stove to get hot so she could cook breakfast. Sitting in the dim light of the kitchen, I heard her say, "God, I don't know what you have in store for me today, but will you take care of my family, I love them so much and they need you to watch over them." What I learned from watching and listening to her pray was the pure humility of turning things over to God every day. We at Calvary have the opportunity to pray daily for those on the prayer list, as well as our own personal prayers. Just like my Granny taught me – I bet someone in your life also taught you how to pray. Let's take time to pray. Blessings, Butch




