From the Pastor...

I recently sat down with someone who was having a relational problem with a coworker. Both of them are believers. Both of them are active in church. Both of them have good hearts. Both of them just want what is best for their workplace. But sometimes, they disagree. And sometimes, someone gets a little sharp, or frustrated, or is a little on edge, which just adds to the discomfort. As this person explained the situation to me, I was not only reflecting on that specific situation in their lives, but I was also reflecting on the enormity of societal unrest and hurt and distrust and frustration and discord that is going on in our land with the trial of the officer accused of killing George Floyd. Then, add to that the tragedy of the officer who drew out her pistol

rather than her taser and shot Daunte Wright. Then add to that the riots associated with these tragic incidents. Then add to that the other shootings and killings around our nation. In all these situations, and even in the way we discuss them with others, we have to make a choice: how will we talk about and think about such difficult matters?

First, we must be able to listen. We must hear the other side, even when we think we know the full story. We must actually listen. When someone is talking to us, we are often thinking of what we will say next rather than really listening to what they are saying with an intent to understand. Listen.

Second, we must seek to understand. We must hear what they have to say and then try to see from their perspective. Everyone has their own perspective that is formed from their own life experiences and personalities. To seek to understand someone else's perspective can be unsettling because it forces us to move off what we have understood in our own mind to be the only perspective and instead view things from an angle that might challenge some of our beliefs, values, or biases.

Third, we must seek the truth. No matter what that means to us or to those things we have invested ourselves in, we must seek the truth. No matter the source, truth is truth. This is harder than it seems, because only God has all the evidence, knows all the motives, understands all the contributing factors. But, to the best of our ability, we must seek truth beyond opinion, beyond bias, beyond ignorance, beyond pride.

Fourth, we must love. We tend to put people into "camps" of either those who are "for us" or those who are "against us." We draw up sides of our "friends" and our "foes." We often to this unconsciously. But Jesus says, even those who we would find in our "enemy" camp, we should love them. To love them means simply to care about their good. It means to wish no harm and to do no harm. It means that we, as followers of Jesus, want the restoration of lives, not the destruction of lives. It means we work toward healing, not hurting. It means we pray for everyone to have a second chance from the God of second chances. It means that we intercede on their behalf with God, praying earnestly for God's transforming power to reshape their lives and their futures toward the Kingdom.

My lunch friend and the coworker I described above are going to be just fine, because they both seek to listen, to understand, to find the truth, and to love. They will be just fine, I am sure of it. But the land in which we live, I'm not so sure. Yet this I do know, if the Church of Jesus Christ models to the world how relationships should look by listening, understanding, seeking truth, and living in love, then there is hope. There is hope – there is light -- for our land, for our lives, for our children, and for the world.
