From the Pastor...

Happy New Year! As we embark on a new year and the hope that comes with the turning of

— January 2022—

our calendar from 2021 to 2022, we ponder what his New Year will bring. Of course, we hear folks speak of a "new normal" as we continue to live our lives dealing with COVID-19. Some have said that we will continue to deal with COVID for a long time, potentially the rest of our lives. Maybe, they say, it will be something for which we receive an annual vaccine much like the flu shot. Or, maybe COVID-19 will develop other variants, even some more serious than what we have seen so far. Most believe that life will need to shift and adapt to a "new normal." In protest to this notion of a "new normal," someone told me recently that they don't want a "new normal," they want "the old normal." They want things to go back to the way they were before mid-March 2020, before COVID-19. "That's what I want, too!" I replied.

Isn't that what we all want? We want to go back to the way life was before COVID. We want to forever rid our faces of masks (maybe even have a mask burning party!) We want to be able to spend time with family and friends and our church family without having to give a second thought to vaccines and viruses and social distancing.

Unfortunately, part of the "new normal," if we call it that, when it comes to church is that for many, church has morphed into something that looks quite different than it did just two years ago. Church is on-line for many more of us. Or, church attendance is no longer part of our routine, so we are more likely to miss church, or stop attending all together. Of course, at Calvary, we want to reach those who cannot attend church, which is why we post a video of our worship service each Sunday afternoon on our website. And, in order to reach even more people, we will soon be posting our service LIVE on Facebook. Beginning mid-January, each Sunday morning, folks can tune in at 10:30 for our live worship service.

But I hope that our "new normal" does not exclude the gathering together of believers in corporate worship. Church is not man's invention. The gathering together of believers in Jesus is not something that we came up with as a good idea for ourselves and for the world. The church is God's idea, and we need it. This is one of our Core Ministry Principles at Calvary, which states:

The Church is God's idea, and we need it. After Jesus' death and resurrection, he appeared to his followers before bodily leaving this world. As his followers gathered together in worship, prayer, and community, the Holy Spirit (the Spirit of God and of Jesus) came to be present with them to empower them to share the Good News of Jesus with the world. This was the start of the Church. To follow Jesus means to be part of a local church that is part of the bigger universal Church. We can't follow Jesus alone; we need others to encourage us, challenge us, love us, and be real with us. Being part of a Christcentered, others-focused church is essential for all who follow Jesus.

In the New Year, how about our "new normal" be a renewed commitment to the work of Christ in the world through His Church. Of course, that was and always has been the Church's "old normal." Our "new normal" for church should be our "old normal": gathering together for worship, studying the scriptures, going into our community and world in the name of Christ, sharing the Gospel with others, and being the hands and feet of Jesus individually and together as the body of Christ. So, we do have something great to look forward to in 2020, don't we!
