From the Pastor...

It is often with a hint of celebration that I remind myself that February only has 28 (or possibly 29) days. It is the last full month of the winter season, and although I enjoy winter, I am always ready for Spring by the end of February.

February is a "quiet" month. By that, I mean that the business of the holidays and the New Year are long since a memory. Easter is yet a good ways in the future. There is no grass to mow, no garden to work. When a big snow comes, it is even quieter, and calmer, and slower.

It is ok to be "quiet." In fact, it is needed. We need quiet, calm. We need to slow down. We need to not always rush around doing. February provides an opportunity to be guiet.

And then, right in the middle of this quiet month, comes Valentine's Day. Now, I'm not big on the commercialization of love. As a friend of mine once told me, "I don't need Hallmark to tell me it's time to give my wife flowers!" But, I do believe there is something to be noted about the timing of Valentine's Day, which, for those of us in this longitude and latitude on the globe, comes during the cold, windy, snowy, short, quiet, slowed-down month of February. Valentines' Day -- complete with roses -- often used to attempt to communicate and express the intensity and beauty of love. A rose is a beautiful thing, isn't it.

I'm reminded of "The Winter Rose", a lovely cantata by composer Joseph M. Martin, and the opening piece which bears the same name. It begins this way: "While the world lies frozen beneath the chilling breath of winter, a spotless rose blooms. Against the harsh surroundings, its beauty unfolds one pedal at a time." Martin's cantata contrasts the gift of God's love given to us in Jesus Christ with the cold, harsh, white-ness of winter. Can you visualize it? A single red rose that stands out against the white backdrop of a quiet, cold February snow-filled day?

I love the imagery of that single red rose, blooming against the stark whiteness of winter, this symbol of life and love breaking through the cold and snowy ground. In the stillness, in the quiet. One rose. A gift of love. A Valentine to the world from God.

In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. — I John 4:9-11

We need to be quiet, and still. We need to listen and watch. We need to pay attention, for love has appeared, and has given, and continues to give. "For God so loved the world that he gave..." a Rose. Happy Valentine's Day, world.
