# From the Pastor...

The story of Christmas is much too familiar to most of us to stir within us the awe, the wonder, the sense of mystery that it ought. A virgin gives birth to a baby boy, conceived of the Holy Spirit of God, who's father is the God of heaven, Creator of the universe. Outside of the story of Creation itself — when God spoke into the dark abyss of space and time and brought forth the

universe – there is no other more powerful story of God's amazing engagement with creation than story of Christmas. In fact, in the story of Christmas, there is not just engagement with creation, but entanglement. God becomes entangled with creation, becoming part of the created order through the incarnation: God becomes flesh.

And this is what makes the message of Christmas so transformative in the way we understand who God is. God is not just the God of heaven, distant, far-removed from our lives and circumstances. God is "with us." God comes to us in flesh and bone and blood. In wet diapers and tiny little toes. In being nursed and being held and being rocked to sleep. In all the things any little baby would experience. God is forever entangled with creation, not just through Jesus' infancy, but throughout Jesus' life and into all of eternity. Through the birth of Jesus, God expressed to us His nearness to us in our humanity. The divine embraces a lower form of existence in order that we might see the divine more fully and know that God is not so far away after all.

So, for all that is familiar about the story of Christmas – shepherds, angels, wise men – there are those things we can never fully grasp. We cannot understand the "how" of the incarnation, how it was that Jesus is God Incarnate, in the flesh. We cannot understand how a virgin could conceive a child with no earthly father, but rather, through the Holy Spirit. We cannot fathom an embryo that grows into a little baby boy who grows into a man who goes to a cross and dies and three days later is resurrected to new life and who 40 days later ascends into heaven and promises that one day He will come again. The story of Christmas is all to familiar, as is the complete story of Jesus. But for all of its familiarity, if we give pause even for a half a second, it will catch our breath – like that first breath of a newborn baby when He enters the world He created and, with an infant's cry said, "God is with you, now, and forever."

I love Christmas.


# **Christmas Angel Tree**




Thursday, Dec 1
