From the Pastor...

I was recently talking with a pastor friend who told me that he had been contemplating moving... not across town, not to another county, not to another state, but to another country. And moving not because he sensed God's call to mission work or a ministry in another country. He said he was contemplating moving to another country because of his disillusionment with the status of things in America. He shared that after he had bemoaned within himself some of the problems in America and had listed some of the reasons he wanted to live elsewhere, something in him suddenly reoriented his thinking. He was immediately

struck with all the reasons that, as he put it, "America is the best place to live in all the world."

On Tuesday, July 4, this nation will celebrate 247 years of independence. Freedom. And with freedom comes responsibility. To be sure, mistakes have been made and will continue to be made. Neither our history nor our present are perfect – far from it. And to be sure, there will be much ahead of us in this nation that will go terribly wrong, and there will be plenty of blame to go around. But as with anything in life, we need to keep our perspective.

First, we need to keep our perspective when we compare our freedoms, our blessings, our opportunities to those that exist in many other nations. We are indeed blessed to be free, and that is not something we should take for granted or overlook. Opportunities abound on every corner. And maybe we have too many blessings... and that makes us less grateful for what we do have than we ought to be.

Second, we need to keep our perspective when it comes to our expectations. We often expect more out of our government and leaders and decision-makers than we ought. They are human. They are as fallible as any of us. That doesn't mean we don't hold them accountable, and it certainly doesn't mean that we aren't responsible for how we respond to egregious failures on the part of our leaders and those vying for our loyalty. But, they often are unable to do the things we expect them to do because they aren't guided by the Lord. And even if they are guided by the Lord, they may have a different perspective on things than we do. We need to keep our perspective and manage our expectations.

Third, we need to keep our perspective on what the world offers when compared to what the Kingdom of God offers. This world is not the Kingdom, and Jesus' Kingdom is not of this world. Yes, we, the church, strive to bring the light of Christ into the world as his ambassadors. But it is not up to us to bring the Kingdom. Only God can do that, and only at the end of time.

So, I don't want to move. I don't want to leave this country, my home. And it's not because it is perfect, and it is not because all things are the way I want them to be, or the way they ought to me, or the way they might be if this or that were different or better. No, I don't want to leave because I don't know where else I would go that would offer all that I have at my fingertips in this great land. And another thing: I don't want to go because I've been called to a mission field, planted in one. And you have too. And it's in your backyard. And it's a beautiful backyard, isn't it?

So, go into your backyard and celebrate your independence. Grill a hotdog. Carve up a watermelon. Say a prayer of thanksgiving. Gather with friends and family. And know that even in doing all of that, you've got a lot to celebrate. And don't forget who you are...




Independence Day Celebration Cookout
