



From the Pastor...

No Labels, Except One

Reformation Day is October 31, every year. It commemorates the day Martin Luther is said to have posted his Ninety-five Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany (October 31, 1517), later identified by Protestants as the beginning of the Reformation. Luther's initial objective was to reform the Catholic Church, not split from it. Luther's

complaints against his Church centered on a number of abuses -- the sale of indulgences being at the top of the list. For a sum of money, the church would offer special prayers for the dead, asking God to pardon the dead to reduce their term of suffering in purgatory. Luther challenged the church's sale of such indulgences in order to pay for the church's grandiose cathedrals. He later began to see other abuses of the church and challenged the church's practice and theology based on his reading of the Holy Scriptures.

Luther's passionate work, along with others in the Reformation era, led to what has been called the Five Solas: sola scriptura (Scripture alone), solus Christus (Christ alone), sola fide (faith alone), sola gratia (grace alone), and soli Deo gloria (glory to God alone). These foundational principles were asserted to directly challenge one or more aspects of the teachings and practices of the Church. For example, "sola scriptura" or "Scripture alone" challenged the idea that the pope was infallible, that the pope could not err in his doctrine, policy, or guidance. Luther's point was that the Holy Scripture should be followed, not the Pope, because while the Pope would err, the Scripture would not. The words of Holy Scripture, said Luther, are the basis for our faith, not the words of the Pope. Luther, and others, advocated that the Holy Scriptures are the rule or guide for ALL matters of faith and practice.

Aside from folks like Luther, there were other reformers, called "radical Reformers" who didn't seek to reform the Catholic Church; they felt the only possible remedy for the errors of the church was total separation. A group called "Anabaptists" emerged, comprised of those who found no Biblical basis for the Church's practice of the baptism of infants. They re-baptized themselves as adults, based on their own personal confession of their faith in Jesus Christ – what we call "believer's baptism." Baptists likely have some historical ties to this group, along with churches led by John Smyth and Thomas Helwys, two Puritan separatists who believed in the separation of church and state and that the church should be self-governing. These and others like them paved the way for Baptist denominations to emerge.

Yes, Baptist denominationS. With an S. There were the General Baptists and the Particular Baptists, who had very different understandings of the sovereignty of God and human free-will, and who disagreed on whether Jesus' death was effective for all (humanity in general) or just some (the chosen in particular).

Needless to say, the Reformation ultimately led to Denominationalism. Today, there are an estimated 47,000 Christian denominations. And for much of the past 400+ years, people chose which church they would attend or join based on the denomination of the church, particularly the major ones such as Baptist, Presbyterian, Methodist, Lutheran, Episcopalian, Anglican, etc. But in the year 2023, no more is that the norm. And in reality, the identity markers of most of the denominations are so blurred, denominational identity has become less than helpful, and sometimes, unhelpful.

I am a Protestant. I am a Baptist. Or at least I have been. I have journeyed with Christ from my early childhood in the era in which the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship (CBF) split off the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) over issues such as the role of women in ministry, and more broadly, the way we go about reading, understanding, interpreting and applying the Bible. But over the last few years, things have continued to change, both in the CBF and the SBC. The SBC has made news as they have recently ousted churches who have chosen to call women as ministers, and also, has been embroiled in controversies around the nondisclosure of sexual misconduct allegations. The CBF has continued to move toward a "progressive" position on several pressing social issues and supports ministry partners for whom inclusivity of thinking, not Biblical authority, seems foremost (my assessment). For these and other reasons, it is hard to find a denominational home for many who have previously called themselves Baptist. For these and other reasons, almost two years ago, Calvary created our own Missions Giving Plan which gives us the flexibility and responsibility to choose missions and ministry partners who we feel represent our core values and Guiding Ministry Principles.

I suppose I will always be a Baptist of some type at heart, I'm just not sure any longer what type. But, what is much more important than the label I carry (Baptist or otherwise) is what I communicate about my faith in the Jesus of the Bible to others. And to the degree that any label other than "Follower of Jesus" turns someone away from the Gospel, I don't want a label. I want what Luther wanted... to be faithful to the Scriptures, guided by the Holy Spirit, with the Jesus of the New Testament as my lens for interpreting and applying all the Bible. And whatever that means in terms of my denominational identity doesn't matter much to me any longer. I'm just trying to follow Jesus and friend the world. And I'm glad I'm partnered with this group of people called Calvary who are just trying to do the same thing.
