

From the Pastor...

I love those "surprises" in the Scriptures. I love the things that we read over quickly, maybe for years, and then, when we stop to understand what is being said, we are surprised. There's one such passage in the book of I Peter that I hope has caught your attention. It's actually an amazing passage, one that can reshape a lot of what we think and how we understand God and God's ways.

In I Peter 2:9, the Apostle Peter, the first bishop of the church in Rome, is writing to the gentile (non-Jewish) believers scattered through-out gentile areas like Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia (not Judea or Israel). He writes: "But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people." What a surprise! These gentiles who have become "obedient to Jesus Christ" (1:1) are now described with terms and words that would have only been used previously for Jews, for Israel. Gentile believers in Jesus (together with Jewish believers in Jesus) are now "a chosen race." The idea of a "chosen race" was a clear reference to the Old Covenant that God had with the Hebrew people, the Jews, Israelites. It was language that distinguished Jews from the rest of the "non-chosen" world. And Gentile believers in Jesus are now "a royal priesthood," again, pointing to the Levitical priests of Israel. No longer are the Priests of God from a particular Israelite lineage. And Gentile believers in Jesus are "a holy nation." Geographical boundaries no longer identify the "tribes" or "nation" of God. What once was the claim of national Israel now is used to describe any and all who are followers of Jesus, from any nation or tribe or language or people. And Gentile believers in Jesus are now "God's own people", or more literally, "a people for God's possession." Again, language that was historically used to describe the singular "people of God" called the Jews or Israel.

In Christianity today, there is a lot of theology that surrounds the idea that the modern-day nation of Israel is still "God's chosen people." The problem with that theology is that it doesn't align with the core of the New Testament and the Gospel of Jesus. Here in this surprising passage, Peter makes it clear. The church – the assembly of all those who are called to faith in Jesus – the church now inherits the language once used to refer only to Israel. In the New Covenant of God, the church becomes the new people of God.

So, if you are part of the church of Jesus Christ through your faith in Him and through the work of the Holy Spirit to bring about your re-birth into the family of God, then you are, in fact, part of this "holy nation" of God. You are part of the new humanity (Ephesians 2:15-16) in which God has broken down the dividing wall between Jew and Gentile and, as Paul says, "created one new humanity in place of the two."

So... Surprise! There truly is no longer a distinction between Jew and gentile. Surprise! There are no national boundaries in God's eyes. Surprise! There are no claims to land based on ethnicity or previous precedent. Surprise! There are no special blessings reserved for a select few. Surprise! Your race doesn't matter. Your ethnicity doesn't matter. Where you live doesn't matter. What religion your parents or ancestors followed doesn't matter. All that distinguishes between people is whether you are "in Christ" or not "in Christ", whether you are a follower of Jesus, or not. The scripture is clear: those who are "in Christ" are "God's own possession," all of us! All of us, together as one, with a shared purpose, according to Peter, which is this: "that you may proclaim his mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light." (I Peter 2:10)

So... Surprise! And isn't it a wonderfully glorious surprise?!
