

From the Pastor...

I grew up listening to country music. Here in Asheville, the station was WWNC, and the morning show was hosted by Scotty Rhodarmer. I remember the catchy little tune he often played to hallmark his show: "Nothing could be finer than to be in Carolina in the mo—o—o—rning." (Yes, I'm singing it as I write.) I was born and raised in Asheville, in the mountains of WNC, and I so deeply found agreement with the sentiment that Scotty celebrated with that tune: there's no other place I'd rather be.

Of course, Asheville has changed a lot since then, over the last 40 to 50 years. I see it... and those of you who have lived here longer than I have certainly see it more starkly. One of the most significant ways Asheville has changed (and there are many) is the magnitude of the homeless population. In fact, Haywood Road is a "hot spot" among the homeless. Some come from far away, and there are frequently new faces, some intentionally having found their way to WNC, and Asheville in particular. On a typical day on a drive down Haywood Road, there are likely a dozen or more such folks on the street, many with shopping carts piled high with whatever possessions they have acquired for the moment.

From time to time, homeless folks camp out on the church campus. Possibly in the "nook" into the church office area. Possibly on the back porch of the Welcome Center entrance of the Bell Tower. Possibly in the bushes. Possibly any number of places. (You may notice some new signage our security team has placed, calling attention to a couple of new cameras in these locations.) Just last week, I met a lady who had taken up residence on our campus. I talked at length with her. I provided a verbal list of shelters and programs in Asheville for her to reach out to in order to find help. (She said she had tried them all and they all were full.) I met her immediate needs: food, clothing, hygiene. I talked with her about her current situation. (I discovered that she, unlike many homeless in West Asheville, grew up in Asheville and that she has family in Asheville.) I talked with her about the Lord, invited her to church, and prayed with her. In the days following, I had several more conversations with her, and, yes, I granted her request to stay on the campus one more day, one more night... several times. But then, after several days and nights, it became obvious that "this just is not going to work." I told her... and the man who had come along as well... that they would need to find other shelter, better shelter, not on the church's campus. I hope she did.

The reality is that our church is not equipped to be a place of shelter for the homeless. There are many facilities and programs in the Asheville area that are: we are not. And yet, it can be difficult to tell a homeless person that they cannot continue to "take up residence" on our campus. It is difficult when you realize that housing is not the only need, and in many cases, it is not the primary need. There are most often addictions, mental illnesses, and other large issues that play into their current situation. There are most often profound causes involved that we are completely unequipped to handle. Recognizing the enormity of the challenges they face, there are much better places for folks who have these needs than the concrete floor of our church's porch.

I'm thankful that there are several individuals in our congregation who work (vocationally) directly with the homeless or whose work supports ministries or programs that do. Thank you! Some in our church volunteer weekly in ministries that touch the homeless. Thank you! Through our Calvary Missions Giving Plan, we financially support local ministries that care for the homeless, including providing housing. Thank you! Through our monthly Hands-On Missions opportunities, we have opportunities to serve the homeless. Thank you! There is good work being done, in the name of Jesus, to try to meet the needs of the homeless. Thank you!

So, while the Calvary Campus simply cannot be a place of residence for the homeless of West Asheville, we are part of the larger effort to meet their needs. And, as I walk down Haywood Road, I hope and pray that what we are doing – as a church, as a community, as a city – is really helping. And I pray that Jesus is helping... knowing that Jesus is ALWAYS helping, and present, and walks among us... even on Haywood Road in West Asheville. And nothing could be finer.


